


## Field trip assignment week 10

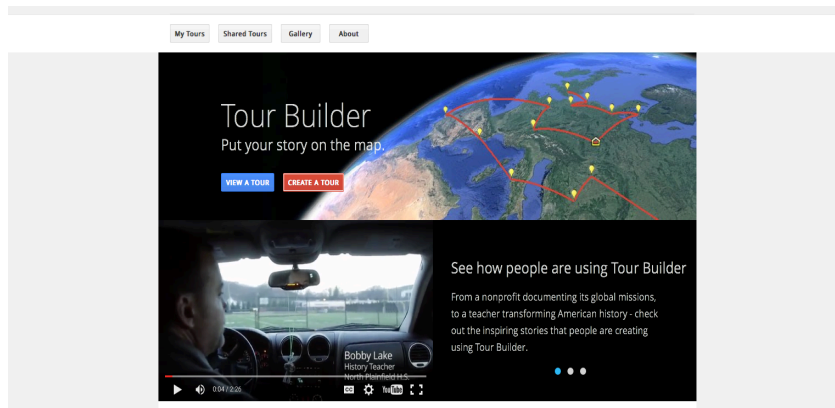
This week you are being asked to work with your Wednesday class group to create a short walking tour demonstrating your experience of Vancouver as a multi-cultural city. Below are the steps which you must take in order to complete this assignment:

1. Create a Gmail alias or fake address for your whole group
2. Go to the Google Tour Builder website [<https://tourbuilder.withgoogle.com>]
3. Sign in with your Gmail account



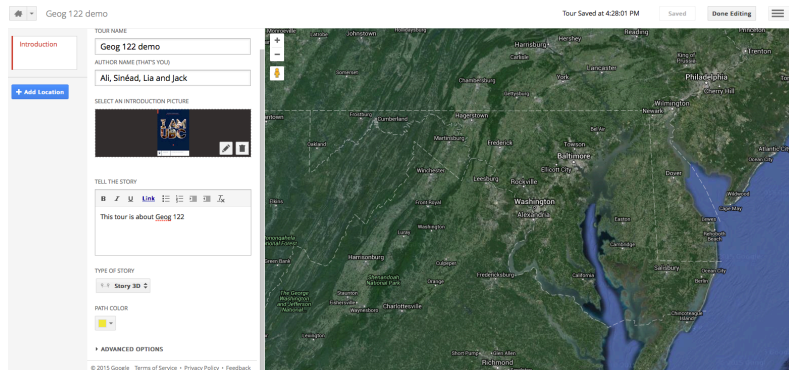
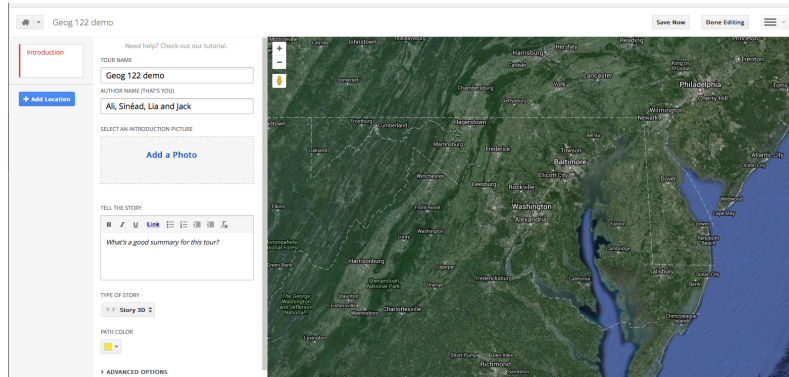
4. Click on create a tour



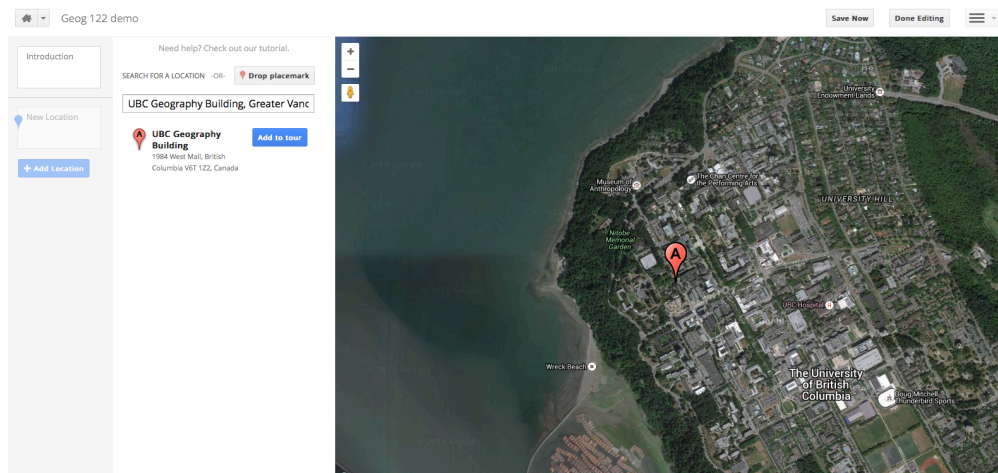
5. Create a tour name and enter the names of all your group members

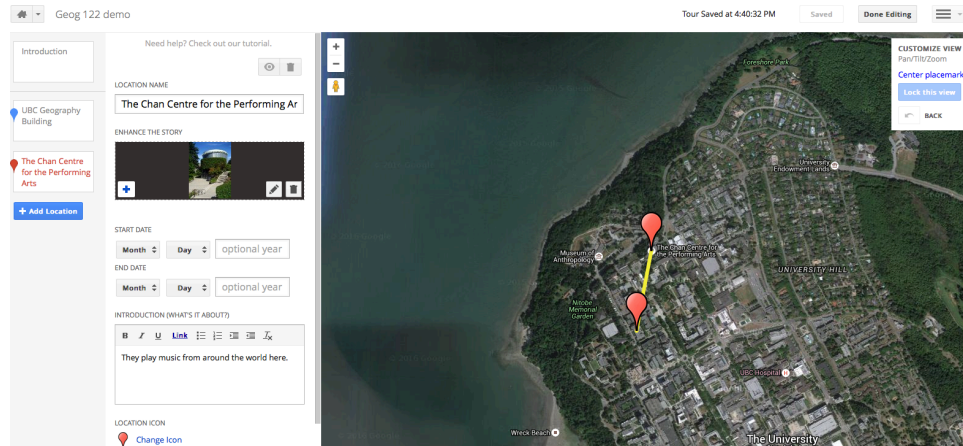
6. Write an introduction for your tour along with a photo. This introduction should give an overview of your tour and how it represents multiculturalism in Vancouver. REMEMBER THAT ALL IMAGES USED MUST BE FROM CREATIVE COMMONS (<https://search.creativecommons.org>) or you can of course use your own images.



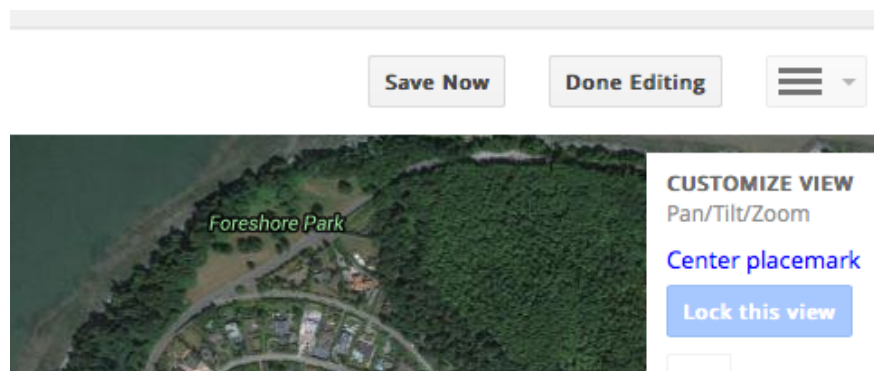
7. Create the first location which will be the starting point of your tour and add some text and an image explaining why this is your starting point.



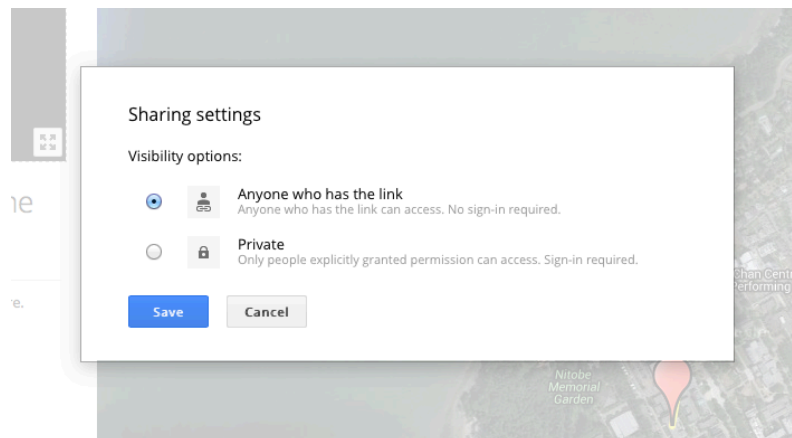
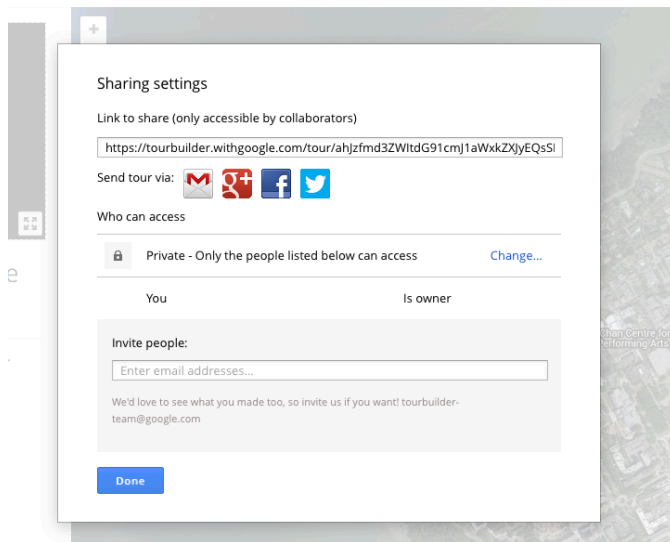
8. From the tools select add a location and plot the second stop on your walking tour– repeat the step above to add text and a photo to your point explaining why this is an important point. Remember that each point should represent something your group thinks is important about Vancouver as a multicultural city.



9. You should repeat this step five times in total so that you have a starting point, three points along the route and an ending point. **Please make these points a realistic distance from each other so that someone could complete the walking tour in less than one hour.**
10. When your points are complete select Done Editing in the top right corner



11. Click the Share button and then make your map available to anyone with the link. Make sure you Play it in full screen to see how cool your tour looks.



12. One student should send the link to your map to Dr. McPhee at <Siobhan.mcphee@ubc.ca> by Sunday the 20<sup>th</sup> of March at midnight. **Only one group member needs to send the link as it is a group grade. Please make sure you write all your names and student numbers in the email.** You will be graded on how imaginative and creative your walking tour is and also on whether it can realistically be completed in one hour of walking.
